Event Date: Saturday, May 5, 2018

Check-In at 7:45 AM (Each contestant must check in with waivers, bow and arrows)

Morning Start Time: 8:30 AM

Break for lunch when morning relay finishes

Afternoon Check In: 12:45 PM (Each contestant must check in with bow and arrows)

Afternoon Start Time: 1:30 PM

Estimated Finish Time and Awards: 5:00 PM

Orientation will be held at each field prior to event start.

Participants will have the option to choose Mood 600 <u>or</u> 3D <u>or</u> to participate in <u>both</u> when registering on 4-H Connect. We will divide the field with ½ of the youth shooting Mod 600 and ½ shooting 3-D in the morning and then switch in the afternoon. Please mark your preference for which you shoot in the morning when registering on 4-H Connect. We will accommodate requests as we process registration on a first come first serve basis (determined by the date your registration was submitted on 4-H Connect.) Awards for the two separate events will be held as soon as all scantron are tabulated. First – Fifth place will be awarded in each Age Group/Bow Class. Please indicate any needed Accommodation Requests when registering on 4-H Connect.

Entry Deadline: Registration on 4-H Connect

Entry Fee: Entry Fee is \$20 per youth.

This includes your choice or Modified 600 and 30 3-D targets or both.

Late registration will be open from April 21st -23rd for an additional fee of \$25 plus

\$20 registration fee. Onsight registration will not be available.

Agent Responsibilities / Contest Responsibilities

Check in:

Check in Table for morning and afternoon:

Step 1: (morning check in only) 3 or 4 people to collect waivers, and issue Scantrons, lunch ticket; contestant initials master list

Step 2: 2 people – Verify personal information, match and bow class for each contestant;

Step 3: 2 people – Verify that the bow presented is correct for the bow class on the scorecards; verify that the arrow is less than $^{23}/_{64}$ -inch diameter. Collect the Scantrons.

Step 4: 2 people - Squad shooters in groups of 2, 3 or 4 with shooters from other counties if possible – Mod 600 is squadded by age group – 3-D is preferably squadded with at least 1 person in each age group

Mod 600 -

1 Range Master – gives the orientation, calls the squads, calls the line and provides the whistle commands, deals with any questions regarding major problems

3 or 4 Range Officers – observes shooters for safety and any other issues, observe/assist with scoring questions and arrow retrieval; keep things moving between ends

3-D -

1 Range Master – gives the orientation, calls the squads, supervises the whole course, deals with any questions regarding major problems

8 – 10 Range Officers - observes shooters for safety and any other issues, observe/assist with scoring questions and arrow retrieval; keeps a close eye on arrow retrieval in the brush; keep things moving between ends, monitors parents, etc. to stay on the road

Tabulation -

Specific Agent(s) to be assigned; duties as assigned

Those working check in will need to communicate with those in tabulation

Specific Agent Assignments will be made after registration closes on April 20th. All Ag and 4-H Agents should hold the date.





Contest Rules & Guidelines

Participation: Participants must be 4-H members currently enrolled in a Texas 4-H & Youth and Development county program and actively participating in the Shooting Sports Project.

Age Divisions: Age divisions are determined by a participant's age as of <u>August 31, 2017</u> as follows:

<u>Division</u> <u>Grades</u>

First Year Junior 8 or 3rd -5th grades & first year to participate in Archery Project

Junior 8 or 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades Intermediate 6th, 7th, and 8th grades

Senior 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grades

3. <u>Bow Classes:</u> Bow classifications will follow the currently published Texas 4-H Shooting Sports Games Handbook. If you have a question about bow classifications, contact a match director. The maximum draw weight for 4-H target archery competitions is 60 pounds. Bows may be subject to verification at the discretion of event management. You must shoot the same bow for each match.

Bare Bow (longbow or recurve): Bows may not be equipped with sights or sighting marks. Mechanical release aids are not permitted.

Recurve: Bows may be equipped with a single sighting device, single pin, multiple pin, or hunting style sights; may not be equipped with string peeps or string marks for rear sights. Laser or other holographic sights which paint a target will not be allowed. Mechanical release aids are not permitted.

Compound Aided: Bows may be equipped with magnified sights and stabilizers. Mechanical release aids are permitted.

Compound Unaided: Bows may not be equipped with magnified sights or stabilizers. Bows may be equipped with fixed single pin or multiple pin sights. No Peep Sight. Mechanical release aids are not permitted.

NASP: This class is utilizing NASP equipment only - Genesis or mini Genesis bows "out of the box" with no sights, sighting marks or stabilizers. No Genesis Pro or Genesis Gen-X bows will be in this class. Mechanical release aides are not permitted. The white nock point may have been replaced with a brass, tied or similar nock point. Only Easton 1820 30" arrows are allowed in this class.

Arrows may not exceed 23/64-inch diameter. A minimum of 6 arrows will be needed. 10 are recommended. A belt quiver or back quiver is required for safe carry.

Optics: Binoculars are allowed. Range finders or similar devices, including cell phone apps will not be permitted.





4. Modified 600:

Dress Code: All archers must wear a shirt with sleeves and closed toed shoes in order to shoot. No flip flops, clogs, Crocs or similar footwear will be allowed. Capris or shorts that are 4-H appropriate will be acceptable on the Mod 600 course ONLY. Long hair must be tied back. Any archer arriving at this course otherwise dressed will not be allowed to enter the course.

Target: Full color, 122-centimeter targets with ten equal and concentric scoring rings.

Course of Fire:

First Year Juniors - 3 ends of 6 arrows at 20 yards, 3 ends of 6 arrows at 15 yards, and 8 ends of 3 arrows at 10 yards; total of 60 arrows.

Juniors - 3 ends of 6 arrows at 30 yards, 3 ends of 6 arrows at 25 yards, and 8 ends of 3 arrows at 20 yards; total of 60 arrows.

Intermediates - 3 ends of 6 arrows at 50 yards, 3 ends of 6 arrows at 40 yards, 8 ends of 3 arrows at 30 yards; total of 60 arrows.

Seniors - 3 ends of 6 arrows at 60 yards, 3 ends of 6 arrows at 50 yards, and 8 ends of 3 arrows at 40 yards; total of 60 arrows.

Time Limits: Shooters have a total of four minutes to shoot each end of six arrows and two minutes to shoot each end of three arrows.

Scoring: The lines between scoring areas of the target are part of the higher value scoring area. A shaft touching ascoring line receives the higher value score. From the center of the target outward, the scoring areas are 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1. Shots outside the scoring area are scored as misses.

5. <u>3-D</u>

Dress Code: All archers must wear long pants and sturdy closed toed shoes in order to shoot. No flip flops, clogs, Crocs or similar footwear will be allowed. Long hair must be tied back. Any archer arriving at this course otherwise dressed will not be allowed to enter the course.

Target: Any quality 3-D target designated by the shoot management may be used in this event. The target at any given shooting station shall remain the same for the duration of the shoot, but each station may use a different type of target. Each target will have a center scoring area and an outer scoring area that cannot be observed with the unaided eye at the shooting stake.

Electronic range finders of any type are not permitted. Standard binoculars are permitted.

Course of Fire:

First Year Juniors & Juniors - shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 30 yards or their metric equivalent.

Intermediate - shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 50 yards or their metric equivalent.

Seniors - shoot a total of 30 targets at unknown ranges from 1 to 60 yards or their metric equivalent.




Time Limits: Although no posted time limits are set, shooters must make ready and shoot in an expeditious manner. Time to judge range, determine kill zone location, adjust sights and otherwise make ready will be provided, but no shooter will impose excessive delay without due cause. A maximum of 2 minutes searching time is permitted for any lost arrow.

Spectators: Those spectating the 3-D match must remain on the roadway in order to maintain an orderly flow of traffic at each shooting station.

Scoring: 12 pts. for center of vital zone ('X'), 10 pts. for heart/inner vital zone, 5 pts. for vital zone, Hit recorded for anywhere on the target outside of the vital zone, Miss recorded for missing the target completely. Bounce outs, pass through or clean misses will be scored M. The lines between scoring zones on the target are part of the higher value area.

Scoring: 12 / 10 / 5 / H / M



Scantrons

Each squad is responsible for recording their scores. If there is a question regarding a scored arrow, request assistance of a range officer. All scoring questions should be resolved at the field prior to turning in Scantrons. Participants will need a **CLIP BOARD**.


- 7. Concessions will be available on site.
